



Phoenix is a Bitcoin wallet using the Lightning network for sending and receiving payments.

It is a free open source software, developed by <u>ACINQ</u> under the <u>Apache 2.0 License</u>.

Note that this wallet is non-custodial: you have sole custody of the wallet's 12-word seed. Do not give this seed to anyone, and beware of phishing.



WALLET RECOVERY BACKUP - CRITICAL!



The recovery phrase (sometimes called a seed), is a list of 12 English words. It allows you to recover full access to your funds if needed.

Only you alone possess this seed. Keep it private.



KEEP THIS SEED SAFE. DO NOT SHARE.

#1 wave #7 rival

#2 grass #8 purse

#3 heart #9 settle

#4 chunk #10 net

#5 cup #11 rack



BIP39 seed with standard BIP84 derivation path

Write these 12 words, down on paper and put clear packing tape over them for protection, until you get a steel plate to stamp them in.

Make two copies.

HIDE THEM VERY,
VERY WELL IN TWO
PLACES.



Settings Recovery Phrase

Do not share this seed with anyone. Beware of phishing. The developers of Phoenix will never ask for your seed.

Do not lose this seed. Save it somewhere safe (not on this phone). If you lose your seed and your phone, you've lost your funds.


While the seed alone is generally all you need to restore the wallet, having all this info ensures you will be able to restore it, in the event new types of wallets become the norm in the future.










It is unlikely you will ever need these, but good to know they are here, in case you ever have an issue and support at Phoenix asks for the logs.

Beware of scammers asking for your 12-words seed!



Phoenix is self-custodial: you (and only you) have the key controlling the funds in the wallet.

This key is made of a 12-words mnemonics, known as a "seed". You can find it in the app settings. Make a backup, and keep it safe. If you lose your seed, we can't help you.

Do not enter your seed in any websites or Google forms. Our support team will never ask for it.







In this example, we are using Lightning

For general daily spending, especially when under \$1000 of fiat value, Lightning is faster and usually cheaper than on-chain.

Recommended to enter an amount.



This fee is because a channel needs to be opened.





In Person:

If you are with the payer, let them scan the QR code to pay you.

Remote:

If it is a remote payment, click 'Share' to send the invoice/payment request.






HOWTO SEND A PAYMENT

If in Person:

- Scan the QR code of the invoice the payee shows you.
- Check the amount is correct.
- Tap 'Pay'.


If Remote:


- Open the text message they sent.
- Copy the long string of numbers and letters, which is the invoice.






- Open Phoenix wallet,or another lightningwallet
- Tap 'Send'.
- Tap 'Paste from Clipboard'
- Tap'Allow Paste'.






- Check the amount is correct.
- Note that the total amount will include a fee of 0.4% to send a payment.
- Tap 'Pay'.
- After a few seconds it will show as 'Sent'.






Once the payment is complete it will reflect in your payment history, at the top of the list.




This wallet received 8,239 out of a 10,000 sat payment, because a channel had to be opened.


The cost was a 1,000 sat Service Fee (one time) and a 761 sat Miner Fee (which will vary if splicing is needed to add liquidity in the future).

In order to receive this payment, a new payment channel was opened. This is not always required.



PHOENIX WALLET	FEES
Sending via Lightning	0.4%
Receiving via Lightning	No Fees
Sending On-chain	Mining Fees
Receiving On-Chain (swap-in or to add Lightning liquidity	Mining Fees (+ 1000 sat one time)





ON LIQUIDITY:

This means you can receive up to almost 23,471 sats and you can send up to almost 8,239 sats (a little less to leave room for fees).

If you need to receive more, extra liquidity will be spliced in, for which you will pay the miner's fee.
